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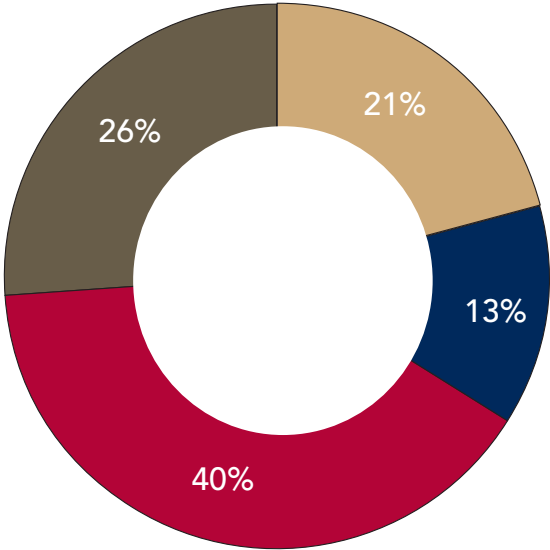
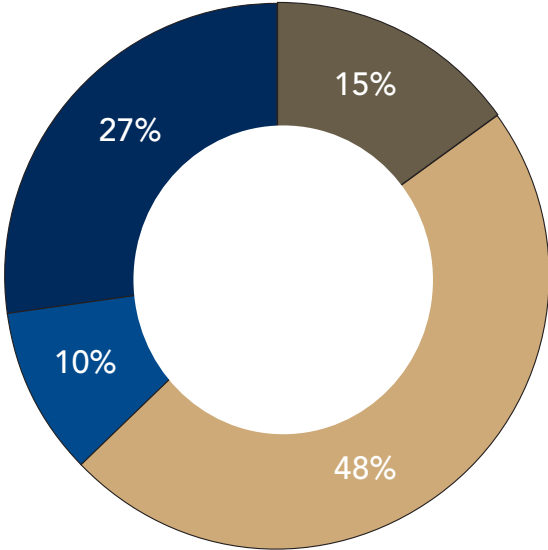

YEAR-END FINANCIAL REPORT 2019

FINANCIAL STATEMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019

JULY 1, 2018-JUNE 30, 2019

For Fiscal Year 2019, we had revenues of \$766,626 and expenses of \$809,487 resulting in a reported net deficit of \$42,861. However, a special project's expenses of \$100,000 fell into this year while the gift for that special project was recorded in the prior year, when it was received. Current year's use of that donation was anticipated in the prior year's financial statements. Consequently, CC@S ended the fiscal year with a modest surplus.

*The Quasi-Endowment is a separate fund treated as endowment by the Diocese, from which CC@S receives a quarterly income distribution. In Fiscal Year 2019, we received three, rather than four, quarterly disbursements. The Quasi-Endowment held at the Diocese is different from the CC@S Endowment held at the Catholic Community Foundation of Santa Clara County.

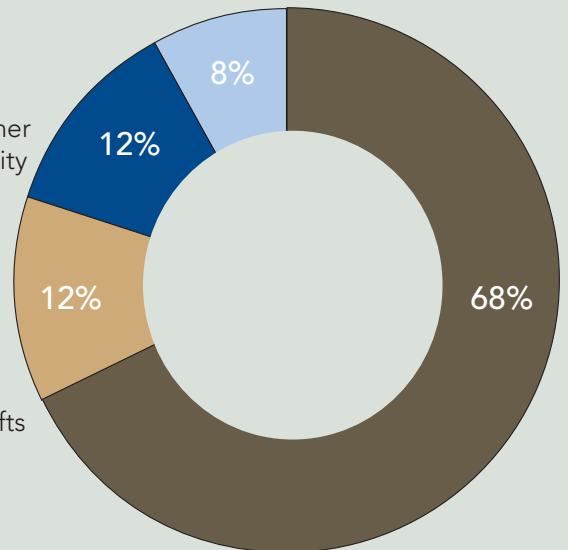
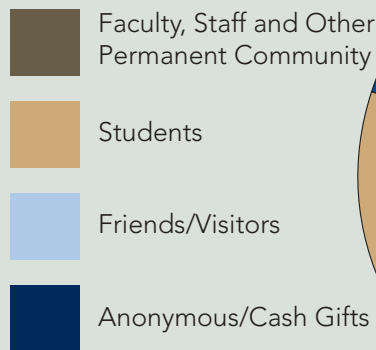
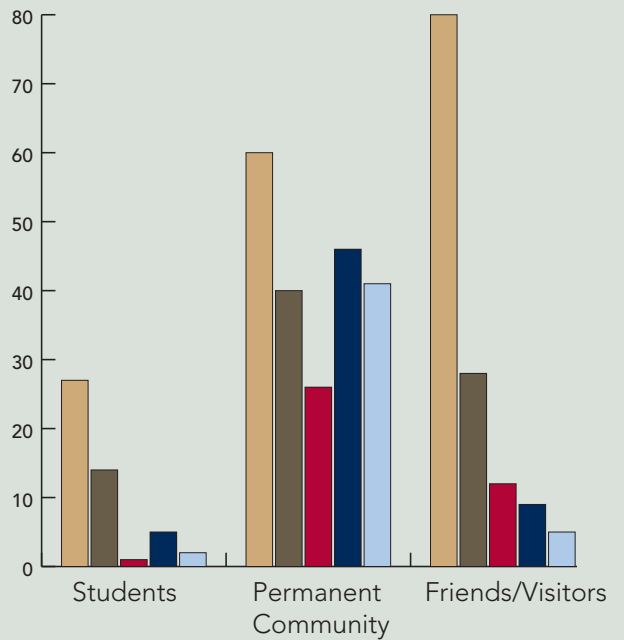
