

with the Holy Spirit in the glory of God the Father.



I shall not die but live anew, declaring the works of the Lord.

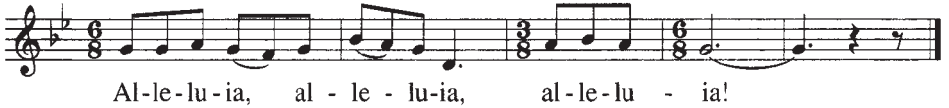
