

Those who aren't Catholic, please participate as much or as little as you feel comfortable. Feel free to stand or kneel with others or to remain seated if you prefer.





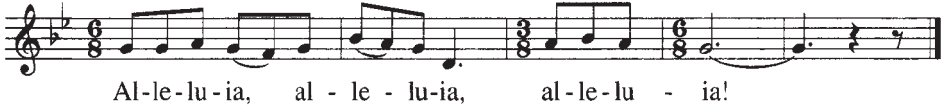

Priest: Behold the Lamb of God... Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

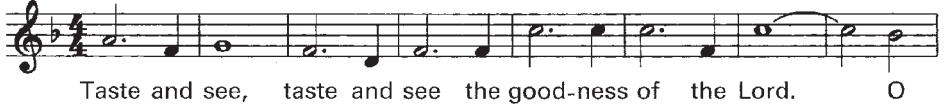
People: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof,

Communion “Esto Les Digo”

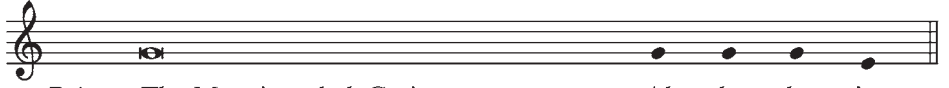
